Minnesota's North Shore hosts one of the largest concentrations of migrating birds in North America. Yet until now, no systematic migration counts have been conducted along the shore beyond Duluth's Hawk Ridge. For the past two years, researchers Gerald Niemi, Heidi Seeland and Anna Peterson have been filling this void with a study of the North Shore's migrating birds.

Ravens: Adventures with the Wolf Birds

The common raven is an uncommonly interesting and enigmatic bird that is distributed over most of the northern hemisphere. It is credited with great cleverness, playfulness and flight ability. The raven has likely been associated with humans since we became huntergatherers, and it is prominent in the folklore of many northern cultures. Yet very little of its intimate life had been accessible for observation; it was almost unknown. The program will explore how a simple question arising from an everyday observation led to a series of studies yielding new insights into the ravens' biology and how these studies have now placed the raven in the category of one of the brainiest birds in the world.
